Milford, Del. (Aug. 28, 2013) – The Food Bank of Delaware announced today that Gwen Guerke has joined the organization as its new Milford Branch Communications Coordinator.

This new role comes at an exciting time for the Food Bank of Delaware as the expanded branch will open its doors to the first class of The Culinary School on September 9, and an official ribbon cutting is planned for September 20.
