FOOD BANK OF DELAWARE RECEIVES GIFT FROM FOOD LION FOR WEST SEAFORD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PANTRY

Seaford, Del. (February 2, 2012) – The Food Bank of Delaware has received \$3,000 from the Food Lion Charitable Foundation to help fund the school pantry within West Seaford Elementary School.

Through the new program, at-risk families with students enrolled in Seaford School District schools will be able to access emergency food and hygiene products by visiting a food pantry within the school. Twenty-five to 30 families will be discretely identified by school officials, and the new pantry will offer a variety of nutritious food products and hygiene items. Families will select food based on their household's needs each week. Food for the pantry will be provided by the Food Bank of Delaware and school-wide food drives or community donations.

The Parent and Family Resource Center at West Seaford Elementary School was created to help increase parent and family involvement in children's education. In addition to offering free computer classes for adults, homework help for students, parenting workshops, and more, the Parent and Family Resource Center also strives to provide support and resources.
